The Leibniz-Zentrum Allgemeine Sprachwissenschaft (ZAS) invites applications for a full-time (39 hrs/week) Post-Doc position (parental leave) for one year starting in Oct. 2020. The deadline for applications is Friday, Sept. 25th, 2020.

The position is part of the Collaborative Research Center SFB-1412- *Register*, Project C02: *Variation in Situative Interaction* located at Leibniz-ZAS in Berlin. The SFB is a collaboration with the Humboldt University Berlin (see <https://sfb1412.hu-berlin.de/de/>). This project within the SFB seeks to develop research paradigms and methods, stimuli, and data that illuminates the social role of the interlocutor(s), the function of the discourse and the overall situative context in the use of fine phonetic detail. The project seeks answers to questions like: What is the role of the perceived gender and personality of the interlocutor or addressee, what is the contribution of the discourse function and what role does that communicative situation play in the choice of fine phonetic detail? If you are interested to work towards finding responses to these questions, please apply!

The successful candidate will have completed a PhD in phonetics and can take over and continue working towards the overall goals of the project. We are looking for a colleague with a good command of German and English who has expertise in experimental methods (production & perception), statistical modelling (Imer; GAMMs) and good working- and scripting knowledge of *R* and *Praat*. We are looking for a motivated individual with knowledge in acoustic phonetics and interest in corpus-based studies, social perception, audio-visual integration and multi-modal language processing.
